

Thomas Seest and Nini Theilade wins Swedish first prize

The Swedish jury announced the winners of the film festival 60 Seconds Dance, and the first prize went to the film "Titania III" by Thomas Seest. A 100 year old Nini Theilade, re-enacts her famous choreography; Titania, queen of the ferries. From the film "A midsummer nights dream", 1935, Hollywood.

Jury's statement:

A precise and quietly detailed reflection of the choreography and the ageing of the body. With modest means, beautiful and intelligent lighting, the film conveys, on subtilast possible way, a whole life in dance.
